Message from the Executive Director

September 7th through the 13th marked National Direct Support Professionals (DSP) Week. Established in the United States in 2008, DSP Recognition Week honors the essential contributions of direct support professionals nationwide. It is a week-long celebration that recognizes and promotes awareness of the critical work that DSPs do every day. While initially designated by the federal government, the observance was formally endorsed by the U.S. Senate and 35 state governors by 2013. DSP Week is now an annual event the first full week in September where organizations like ProBerco proudly host celebrations to honor DSPs and frontline managers for their compassionate dedication and impact.

ProBerco has implemented a variety of initiatives over the years to reward and appreciate our DSPs and frontline managers during this national week of recognition. This year a committee comprised of our Directors organized a week of celebrations. All DSPs and frontline managers received a commemorative T-shirt and a logo pen. Directors also hosted a carwash for any DSP or frontline manager who chose to participate.

One of the most meaningful activities was our "Wall of Praise." Family members, community partners, and managers were invited to submit personal notes of appreciation, recognizing the efforts of team members. Gift cards were awarded to randomly selected professionals whose names appeared on the wall—a small token to honor the big impact of their work.

Moments That Matter



Jody Wagner, CEO, shared a moment that left a lasting impression on her:

"One of our participants, who lives with cerebral palsy and relies entirely on others for his care, told his sister, 'I feel safe when I'm with Artie,' (a longtime ProBerco DSP). Reflecting on that kind of trust—when

someone who depends on another person for everything, feels truly safe, is the highest compliment a DSP can receive. It made me incredibly proud."

This story is a powerful reminder of the deep relationships DSPs build and the trust they earn through consistent, compassionate care.



Maricelys Cerritos – "My proudest moment as a DSP was when I helped a gentleman go to a concert he was dreaming about going to for a while. He would always speak about wanting to see this singer in person, so when I knew the singer was coming into town I helped him get tickets and plan his day. I accompanied him to the

concert and he enjoyed every moment. At the end of the night, when I took him back home, he gave me a big hug and said 'I love you Maricelys, thank you!!!' I knew he had enjoyed himself. He didn't sit, not once, during the concert, and although the concert wasn't in his native language, he sang every song."



Deborah Covington - "Helping people realize their potential and putting a smile on their face."



Susan Dacquisto-Sturges - "I had worked with an individual for many years and got to meet his elderly parents. His mother took my hand and said "thank you for taking care of my boy all of these years." That filled my heart and let me know I was doing my job, and I was good at it."

Andrea Gibson - "Advocating successfully for better support services so a person can go on outings, have a life coach, or have the accessibility modifications they need (are what make me proud). Helping a person learn a skill and seeing them do it confidently on their own, makes me feel good."



Debbie Mateo - "I have many proud moments in my short time here. The first one is being hired and being totally new to this field. After that, it's just moments of pride all day, every day, it's hard to pick one. ... I'm so happy to help and meet people, and to put smiles on their faces by sitting, talking, and listening. Seeing

her in the band, I had nothing to do with it, but it made me and her proud."



David Kisilu - "My proudest moment is witnessing the people I support gain significant improvement of independence and self-determination. Most people can express their needs and preferences, such as choosing what activities to do, (which) range from computer activities, delivery of meals to the community, mak-

ing coffee for others, or organizing the kitchen. But others, need to overcome their fear and gain the confidence to courageously dance in music groups."



Andrea Reber - "My proudest moment was when one of the ladies (I support) explained something very difficult, in a very matter-of-fact way, to her support coordinator; that was my proudest moment."



Maxime Legal - "A moment I am particularly proud of was de-escalating a very stressful situation. I was working with a person who has nonverbal autism and they become overwhelmed by any change in their routine. The task was to help them calm down and find comfort. Rather than simply redirecting them, I

relied on our established communication techniques. I helped him feel secure. I remained calm and patient, giving him the space he needed without forcing any interaction. As a result, the gentelman was able to regulate his emotions and relax without the use of medication or further distress. It showed me the true value of knowing and respecting each individual's unique needs and communication styles."



Felipa Vasquez Dominguez - "It's been almost eight years since I started my career as a DSP at ProBerco, with some insecurity because English is not my first language, but here I have learned that the best language is love. I put a lot of love into what I do and receive it multiplied backwards; the affec-


